





2023 Target

To successfully transition the Free and Healthy Lunch programme from an external provider to 'doing it ourselves'

- Canteen established and ready for the start of term 1
- Staff appointed to run the canteen and lunch programme
- Kitchen upgraded to enable lunch provision for the start of term 2
- Income and expenditure procedures established to receive the government funding
- 'Lunch group' established comprising staff and students to provide input
- Future kitchen upgrade programme developed
- Procedures established for the start of term 2 to cater for rubbish, compost, waste
- Positive feedback from students and staff
